

Gender Equality Index (France)

Sia reports an overall Gender Equality Index score of 99/100 for 2026 (based on 2025 data). The Gender Equality Index is mandated by French law on professional agency, effective from September 5, 2018. This law most notably seeks to eliminate the pay gap between women and men in France.

This score is calculated from the 5 indicators below.

Clarification on the methodology:

The reference period is the fiscal year of Sia (from July 2024 to June 2025).

Indicators 2, 3 and 4 are calculated on the base number of employees eligible for a raise or promotion during the reference period (at least 1 year of seniority before the end of the reference period and excluding the notice period before departure).
